Freedom of information request: Reference 18-043

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the FOI Act) which was received on 25 May 2018. You sought access to documents relating to:

- all policies and procedures and determinations etc in relation to establishing designated park and ride spots in the ACT, as well as the signage for these designated parking spots.

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

TCCS is required to provide a decision on your access application by 26 June 2018.

The information which you have requested is already publically available on the TCCS website at www.transport.act.gov.au/getting-around/bus-services/passenger-info/park-and-ride.

Other reports that discuss the parking policies in the ACT include:

- Building an Integrated Transport Network – Parking; and
- Transport for Canberra – Transport for a sustainable City – 2012 – 2031.

As the information is already publicly available, I have decided to apply section 43 of the Act which allows me to refuse to deal with your application.
