

Preface

The Australian Capital Territory (ACT) has provided the Municipal Infrastructure Technical Specifications (MITS) for use in the construction of civil engineering and landscaping public infrastructure works. Whilst based on the earlier Urban Services Standard Specification for Urban Infrastructure Works, this document has been significantly expanded to incorporate new technologies and to bring it into line with Australian best practice. The MITS series has been based on AUS-SPEC (October 2016) format wherever practical.

The MITS series pertains to roadworks (excluding arterial and higher order roads), stormwater drainage and landscaping required to service residential, commercial and industrial estates for both greenfield and urban in-fill developments. They have been prepared for assets to be owned and maintained by Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS). These assets may be constructed either by a developer and gifted to the ACT Government or constructed as part of the ACT Government Capital Works program. In the interest of uniform construction standards, the appropriate use of these Specifications on other contracts within the ACT is encouraged; however, the ACT Government accepts no liability with regard to the use of these Specifications by others.

Whilst the MITS series are comprehensive in scope, it is acknowledged that unique scenarios may fall outside the scope of these Specifications. In all works, if these Specifications cannot be appropriately applied, the proposed innovation shall be discussed with and approved by TCCS prior to works being undertaken.
