Freedom of Information request: Reference 19-059

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the Act), received by Transport Canberra and City Services Directorate (TCCS) on 24 June 2019, in which you sought access to information concerning parking options along Walhallow Street in Hawker, specifically:

- Which houses were letterboxed,
- A copy of the letter that was letterboxed,
- What feedback was received,
- The letter that was sent to the residents advising them of the outcome.

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act.

TCCS was required to provide a decision on your access application by 22 July 2019. Thank you for the extension until 26 July 2019.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for relevant documents and 40 documents amounting to 51 pages of information have been identified that fall within the scope of your request.

Documents identified as relevant to your request contain information that I consider to be, on balance, contrary to the public interest to disclose under the test set out in section 17 of the Act.

I have decided to grant access, under section 50 of the Act, to copies of documents with deletions applied to information that I consider would be contrary to the public interest to disclose.

I have included at Attachment A to this decision a schedule of the documents. This provides a description of the documents that fall within the scope of your request and provides details as to where information has been redacted as not in the public interest to release. The documents for release are at Attachment B.

Statement of Reasons

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- The Act

Factors favouring disclosure:

- Schedule 2.1 (a)(i) promotion of open discussion of public affairs and enhancement of government accountability;
- Schedule 2.1 (a)(iii) Informing the community of the government's operations, including the policies, guidelines and code of conduct followed by the government in its dealings with members of the public, or reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.

Factors favouring non-disclosure:

- Schedule 2.2 (a)(ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or other right under the *Human Rights Act 2004*.
- *Information Privacy Act 2014*; and,
- the content of the documents that fall within the scope your request.

As an Information Officer I am required to decide where, on balance, public interest lies. As part of this process I must consider factors favouring disclosure and non-disclosure.

I have decided that it is not in the public interest to release the personal information of individuals who have responded to the consultation process. Personal information about individuals includes names and contact details. There is also a small amount of information removed which is either out-of-scope or information of a personal nature provided by consulted citizens. This includes, for example, information about the specific location and description of a residential home which could lead to the identification of the individual in connection with that property.

To release this information would prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or other rights under the *Human Rights Act 2004*. These rights could also include a right to freedom of expression and reputation.

Further, as a rule, an agency that holds personal information about an individual that has been collected for a particular purpose must not disclose the information to a third party without consent (*Information Privacy Act 2014* (Territory Privacy Principle 6)). In this case consent has not been sought for the release of the personal information.

Considering the type of information, I am satisfied that the factors in favour of release can still be met while protecting the personal information of the individuals involved, therefore, I have decided to release the information with deletions applied to information that I consider would be contrary to the public interest to disclose.

Charges

As an MLA you are not subject to charges or fees to access government information under the Act.

Online publishing – disclosure log

Under section 28 of the Act, TCCS maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Your original access application, my decision and documents will be published in the TCCS disclosure log from 3 days after the date of this decision. Your personal details will not be published.

Ombudsman review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision under section 73 of the Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is published in TCCS' disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.



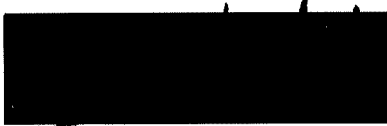

Our names are [REDACTED] and we live in [REDACTED]

However Walhallow St, leading to the Soccer and Softball fields, Delamere and Murrarj! Sts and Hawker college has become a speed way for motorists and motorcyclists. There is almost no parking in our area you have marked. There may be parking problems further down the street near the scout hall facing some of the fields.

However Speeding along Walhallow is horrendous as there is no side street traffic to slow the Walhallow traffic and it is being used as a rat run and race area. Black skids marks near the bend are common. Motor cyclists rev up and roar along.

I would expect this road/lane way to be at least a 50km but most traffic revs up the slight hill then speeds down to the soccer fields before breaking hard at the 90 degree bend or speed down hill and comes to a screeching halt at the corner of Walhallow and Beetaloo.

Even the big mowing and equipment trucks speed at their highest revs.

The busy times are early morning and after work 5pm - 9pm Especially, when scouts parents, soccer, softball practice occurs after work

We would like to request two, 50km signs on Walhallow and an occasional van to slow the traffic.

Reason for Inspection Request

I am very concerned about the safety of children attending sporting and community events on Walhallow Street Hawker, particularly near the Ginninderra District Girl Guides Hall. The current legal parking arrangements are appalling and I believe it is only a matter of time before a terrible tragedy occurs. When I go to pick up my daughter from Guides this evening I will be (legally) required to park in the eastbound lane, essentially blocking it completely. Other parents will also park in this lane causing this narrow stretch of road to become a one way thoroughfare for several car lengths. The signs state "No Parking Sat-Sun" but make no mention of weekdays which are when the Guide groups meet. People attending the adjacent soccer field, bowling club and softball centre add to the traffic using this section of road. I have considered using their car parks but the distance, without an adequate footpath, and a mobility issue makes that very difficult for me. There is a dirt car park opposite the Hall but it is gated and locked. I am very concerned about the safety of children attending sporting and community events on Walhallow Street Hawker, particularly near the Ginninderra District Girl Guides Hall. The current legal parking arrangements are appalling and I believe it is only a matter of time before a terrible tragedy occurs. When I go to pick up my daughter from Guides this evening I will be legally required to park in the eastbound lane, essentially blocking it completely. Other parents will also park in this lane causing this narrow stretch of road to become a one way thoroughfare for several car lengths. The signs state "No Parking Sat-Sun" but make no mention of weekdays which are when the Guide groups meet. People attending the adjacent soccer field, bowling club and softball centre add to the traffic using this section of road. I have considered using their car parks but the distance, without an adequate footpath, and a mobility issue makes that very difficult for me. There is a dirt car park opposite the Hall but it is gated and locked.
