

# Design Standards for Urban Infrastructure

Plant Species for Urban Landscape Projects in Canberra

Botanical Name: Eucalytpus melliodora 'Tarcutta' form (Emt)

Common Name: Tarcutta yellow box

### **Species Description**

- Evergreen
- · Large spreading tree with rounded crown
- Bark is rough to variable heights on the trunk
- Elegant blue foliage
- Creamy white flowers from spring to early summer
- Small rounded woody fruit

### Height and width

20 to 25 metres tall by 20 metres wide

### **Species origin**

New South Wales, near Tarcutta on the Hume Highway, south of Gundagai

### Landscape use

- Available Soil Volume required: ≥100m³
- Large spreading tree suitable for use in parks

# 20-25m

### **Use considerations**

- Well suited to the local climate, but is particularly suited to flatter woodland areas
- High frost and drought tolerance
- Suited to a range of ACT soils, but mainly found on lower, flatter areas off hilly and rocky areas
- Long lived
- Slow to moderate growth rate
- High flammability
- Produces seeds, nectar and a small amount of pollen
- Attracts birds and bees
- Important species for wildlife habitat
