Botanical Name: Laurus nobilis (LRn) Common Name: Bay laurel, Bay tree

Species Description

ransport Canberra nd City Services

- Evergreen
- Tall rounded shrub or small tree
- Shiny grey bark
- Dark green aromatic foliage
- Small insignificant white flowers in spring
- Small shiny black berries

Height and width

6 metres tall by 5 metres wide

Species origin

Mediterranean region

Landscape use

- Available Soil Volume required: ≥15m³
- Can be used as a street tree
- Useful for urban parks and landscaping around suburban shopping centres
- Suitable for use in home gardens
- Ideal for use as a wind break
- Should not be planted near nature reserves, creeks or watercourses

Use considerations

- Has performed well in ACT gardens since Canberra's settlement
- High frost and drought tolerance
- Suits almost all soils in the ACT
- Medium longevity
- Slow growing
- Highly flammability
- Produces nectar and pollen; attracts bees
- Requires formative pruning to create a single trunked tree form
- Fruit drop may be a minor nuisance in pedestrian/paved areas
