


## NOTES

- 1 THIS DRAWING IS TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH MIS05 4.10.
- DIRECTIONAL SIGNAGE IN ESTATE DEVELOPMENT IS NOT TO BE INSTALLED UNTIL SUITABLE FACILITIES EXIST AND LINK TO ALL DESTINATIONS SHOWN ON SIGNS. REFER MISO5 CLAUSE 4.10.10.
- DIRECTIONAL SIGNAGE TO OFF-ROUTE DESTINATIONS SHOULD BE PLACED AT THE DECISION POINT THAT ALLOWS FOR THE SHORTEST ACCESS TO THE DESTINATION FROM EACH APPROACH ALONG THE ROUTE.
- (4) OFF-ROUTE DESTINATIONS THAT HAVE SEPARATE DIRECT ACCESS ROUTES FROM DIFFERENT APPROACH DIRECTIONS ONLY REQUIRE THE INSTALLATION OF DESTINATION SIGNAGE FOR DESTINATIONS ON THE ROUTE AT ONE OF THE LOCATIONS.
- (5) DISTANCE IS NOT REQUIRED TO DESTINATIONS THAT ARE VISIBLE FROM THE SIGNED LOCATION.
- 6 ONLY ENDORSED FOCAL POINT NAMES ARE TO BE INCLUDED AS DESTINATIONS ON DIRECTIONAL SIGNAGE. REFER TO THE ATIPT FOR THE LIST OF ENDORSED FOCAL POINTS INCLUDING POSITION AND ANY ABBREVIATIONS.
- 7 DIRECTIONAL SIGNAGE TO BE INSTALLED TO BE VISIBLE TO ALL ACTIVE TRAVELLERS USING A ROUTE INCLUDING PEDESTRIANS ON PATHS AND CYCLISTS USING THE ROADWAY OR BICYCLE ONLY PATHS.
