Plant Species for Urban Landscape Projects in Canberra

Botanical Name: Fraxinus pennsylvanica 'Cimmzam' (Cimmaron) (FRpc)

Common Name: Cimmaron green ash New species

Species Description

- Deciduous
- Pyramidal shaped tree, opening up as the tree ages
- Greyish-brown bark becoming fissured with age
- Dark green leaves changing to burgundy in autumn
- Insignificant flowers in spring
- Seedless variety

Height and width

10 to 12 metres tall by 8 to 10 metres wide

Species origin

Eastern North America

Landscape use

- Available Soil Volume required: ≥45m³
- Useful in streets, parks and suburban shopping centres
- Proven to be an excellent street tree outside Canberra
- Suitable for use in home gardens
- Should not be planted near nature reserves, creeks or watercourses

Use considerations

- Suited to all areas of the ACT
- High frost tolerance and moderate drought tolerance
- Suitable for most soils
- Medium longevity
- Moderate growth rate
- Low flammability
