The ACT Government seeks to achieve 30 percent tree canopy cover by 2045. Significant time and effort is required by TCCS to manage and minimise the risk of re-routes. However the interaction with other planning and infill agendas seems to not have been explored well in the recent audit. I have a suspicion that tree refusal and instances of re-routing have been more common in higher density areas, particularly in newer suburbs with smaller blocks, narrower roads, and less established trees or in areas that have been ""infilled" with higher density leading to more more demand for parking on verge and nature strips. However, I am looking actual data rather than just guessing and speculating.

Would you like to provide any additional information? (optional)

It would be useful to report on re-routing and tree refusal in similar ways to the current visualisations on tree canopy coverage.

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the FOI Act) received by Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) on 29 February 2024. It is my understanding that you are seeking access to the following information:

"The recent Urban Tree Management Audit included the following information, managing community expectations for the planting of trees is also a challenge for TCCS. Approximately 12.4 percent of all tree planting since Spring 2021 (2,485 trees) have been the "subject of a re-route process. "The Audit also states Re-routes are mostly cause by members of the community opposing the "planting of a tree. I am requesting a breakdown of the instances of re-route by suburb, particularly interested in the instances of tree refusal where community members oppose the planting of the tree. I have a suspicion that tree refusal and instances of re-routing will be more common in higher density areas, particularly in newer suburbs with smaller blocks, narrower roads, and less established trees. However, I am looking actual data".

I thank you for clarifying your request on 25th of March and confirming you are only seeking summary data rather than raw data. As discussed by phone, the summary data is not broken down into suburb levels.

Timeframes

A decision on your application is due on 15 April 2024.

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the FOI Act.

Decision on access

In accordance with the FOI Act, a search of TCCS records has been completed and one record has been identified as relevant to your application. The record identified as relevant to your application is enclosed at Attachment A.

Upon reviewing the information within this record and applying the public interest test under section 17 of the FOI Act, I have found it to be, on balance, in the public interest to provide you with full access. The reasons for my decision are detailed below in the statement of reasons.

Statement of Reasons

In making my decision on disclosing the relevant government information, I must identify all relevant factors in schedule 1 and 2 of the FOI Act and determine, on balance, where the public interest lies. I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act; and
- The Human Rights Act 2016.

Schedule 1:

• No relevant sections identified.

Schedule 2:

Factors favouring disclosure (Schedule 2.1)

• Schedule 2.1(a)(i) - promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability.

• Schedule 2.1(a)(iv) - ensure effective oversight of expenditure of public funds;

• Schedule 2.1(a)(viii) - reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.

Factors favouring non-disclosure (Schedule 2.2)

• No relevant factors identified.

In reviewing the relevant record, I have identified that disclosure is likely to enhance government accountability and reveal reasons for a government decision. I have not identified information where factors favouring non-disclosure apply. I have found that disclosure is, on balance, in the public interest and provide you with full access to the records enclosed at <u>Attachment B.</u>

Charges

In accordance with *Freedom of Information (Fees) Determination 2018,* a fee of \$0.35 per page of information disclosed, except for the first 50 pages, may be applied to an access application. No fees are applicable to this application as the number of pages being released are within the fee-free threshold.

Online publishing – disclosure log

Under section 28 of the Act, TCCS maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. In accordance with section 28, your application, my decision, and the information disclosed to you will be published within 3 - 10 business days. Your personal information will be removed prior to publication. You may view the TCCS' disclosure log here.

Ombudsman review

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the FOI Act. You have the right to seek an Ombudsman review of this outcome under section 73 of the FOI Act within 20 working days from the day that my decision is published in TCCS' disclosure log, or a longer period allowed by the Ombudsman.
