Yes, [Murray Cod are currently managed under a NSCP](#). In case you want more detailed information on the drafting, Sch 1 1.14 led this body of work in policy with input from Sch 1 1.14.

Another option that could be considered is a Controlled Native Species Management Plan, which we apply to Kangaroo management, though I'm not sure that that is the most appropriate approach.

Regardless of the option, applying a plan that is listed as an option under the NC Act is a preferable and recommended approach.

The Biodiversity Policy team recommends that a Native Species Conservation Plan (NSCP) be used to guide management of Wombats instead of a Strategy. A NSCP has legislative weight under the *Nature Conservation Act 2014* than a Strategy so will give EHW and our community partners more authority to undertake management actions. Also, a NSCP will support better protection of Wombats through the integration and relationship that a NSCO has with a Conservator Guideline.

Regarding topics for the review, we recommend:

- Investigating ACT farmer attitudes towards wombats
- Potential of working with farmers to install wombat walkways (through fences)

There should be accountability and repercussions to those within the community actively obstructing a meaningful, logical and rational wombat strategy. Landholders are being denied the ability to safeguard themselves, their workers, infrastructure, livestock, machinery, pets family and friends. This process is a glacial pace.

Wombats are an increasingly large issue for many landholders and it is perceived by the farming community that government is being bullied by the Wombat Lobby. This will eventually force some Landholders to work outside the law.

I welcome "the person doing the external wombat review" consulting with people directly impacted by wombat activity and not involve a cast of thousands and suggest the meeting be a physical meeting not zoom etc.

What timeframe and level of detail are they looking for? Depending on how they want the information presented I can present information as:

- approximate locations
- totals for different time periods
- numbers per issue (injured, deceased, etc)

The Urban Wildlife Program's digital records for Wombats started back in June 2019. As with everything, our records only contain what has been successfully recorded by staff, so don't contain every instance of vehicle strikes on wombats resulting in injury or death of the animal in the ACT over that time period.
