I write to request under the Freedom of Information Act 2016 (FOI Act), the most recent version of the Community Path Infill Program List as well as any documents that may assist in interrogating the list. These documents may include, but are not limited, to the following:

- Metrics that guide how a path entry in the list is prioritised.
- Descriptions of any colour coding used in the list.

# Freedom of Information Request - Reference 24-010

I refer to your application for access to government information received by Transport Canberra and City Services (TCCS) on 25 January 2024. It is my understanding that you are seeking access to the following government information:

"The most recent version of the Community Path Infill Program List as well as any documents that may assist in interrogating the list. These documents may include, but are not limited, to the following:

- Metrics that guide how a path entry in the list is prioritised.
- Descriptions of any colour coding used in the list."

#### **Timeframes**

A decision is due on your access application by 8 March 2024.

#### **Authority**

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the FOI Act.

#### **Decision on access**

In accordance with the FOI Act, a search of TCCS records has been completed and one record has been identified as relevant to your application. The record identified as relevant to your application is enclosed at <a href="Attachment A.">Attachment A.</a>

Upon reviewing the information within this record and applying the public interest test under section 17 of the FOI Act, I have found it to be, on balance, in the public interest to provide you with full access. The reasons for my decision are detailed below in the statement of reasons.

The list being disclosed in response to this FOI differs from the list disclosed in 2022, reference 22-074. This is because the internal assessment methodology has changed between these versions to align with the new Active Travel Plan.

TCCS currently use a Strategic Merit Test (SMT), which is considered in three stages:

- 1. Initial assessment for enquiries received from the community where objectives for strategic path network are achieved.
- 2. Appraisal of identified improvement for paths (or network of paths) that are identified for the next stage.
- 3. detailed appraisal and assessment of identified links considered for construction.

Tables of the metrics considered in the first level of assessment can be found in the first excel spreadsheet (Criteria), with headings "Criteria", "Ranking System" and "Score". Information relating to colour codes used are in the second excel page (Current list).

#### **Statement of Reasons**

In making my decision on disclosing the relevant government information, I must identify all relevant factors in schedule 1 and 2 of the FOI Act and determine, on balance, where the public interest lies. I have taken the following into account:

- The FOI Act; and
- The Human Rights Act 2016.

#### Factors favouring disclosure (Schedule 2.1)

- Schedule 2.1(a)(i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability.
- Schedule 2.1(a)(ii) contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest.
- Schedule 2.1(a)(iii) inform the community of the government's operations, including the policies, guidelines and codes of conduct followed by the government in its dealings with members of the community
- Schedule 2.1(a)(viii) reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision.

#### Factors favouring non-disclosure (Schedule 2.2)

• No relevant factors identified.

In reviewing the relevant record, I have considered the relevance of several factors favouring disclosure, including that the information is likely to promote open discussion of public affairs, contribute to a positive and informed debate, and inform the community about the government's operations. My review did not identify any relevant factors favouring non-disclosure.

I have found that disclosure is, on balance, in the public interest. A copy of the relevant information is enclosed at <u>Attachment A.</u>

#### **Charges**

In accordance with <u>Freedom of Information (Fees) Determination 2018</u>, a fee of \$0.35 per page of information disclosed, except for the first 50 pages, may be applied to an access application. No fees are applicable to this application in accordance with section 107 of the FOI Act.
